New Information

Governor DeWine to Make Announcement Regarding School Closure Next Week

During his daily press conference yesterday Governor DeWine was asked a question directly related to whether school will be in session again this year. He answered by sharing that early next week he would be communicating more information related to when schools will be able to open. We will continue to stay informed and share information with you as it becomes available.

Clarification Related to our New Capped Open Enrollment Policy

Parents of current Maumee students **do not need to take any action** for their children by the May 1 deadline referenced in our last SchoolMessenger alert. Our traditional back-to-school registration day is tentatively scheduled for August 11, but we are awaiting further information from Governor DeWine about timelines for returning to school.

Individuals who live outside the school district may apply for their child(ren) to attend school in Maumee in the 2020-21 school year. Based on our current enrollment, we would have room for just a few students at some grade levels and up to 15 students at others. Capped open enrollment applications will be prioritized based on eight criteria that are set by board policy. The capped open enrollment application deadline is May 1, 2020 and applications may be picked up from the box attached to the front door of the Administration Building (716 Askin Street).
